

The Middle Fork gathering system is 44.1 miles of natural gas pipelines in central Uintah County, UT. The system consists of pipelines ranging from 2 to 20 inches in diameter.

Highly trained and experienced personnel monitor our pipelines using sophisticated Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) systems, so we have real-time information regarding the safety and integrity of our pipeline. We patrol our pipelines by foot, vehicle, aircraft, and satellite to ensure safety and identify potential concerns as soon as possible. We have emergency shutdown systems that can isolate anomalies anywhere in our system quickly and safely.

As part of our ongoing education efforts, we work with first responders using tools such as tabletop exercises and hands on mock drills to ensure they are familiar with our assets and know what to do in the unlikely event of an emergency. In addition, Koda Resources is an active member of the Pipeline Association for Public Awareness (PAPA), working together to educate stakeholders on pipeline safety and promote safe excavation.
