Green Natural Gas Ventures LLC operates natural gas gathering pipelines and compressor stations in Utah and Colorado.

- All facilities are identified with signs stating the facility name
- All pipeline locations are identified with signs at conspicuous locations along the right of way
Except in isolated instances, all pipeline are carbon steel and buried underground
- Natural gas is present in the pipelines at any time
- Pipeline pressure vary from 100 PSI to 1440
- Natural Gas is flammable
- Any exposed pipeline due to erosion, accidental "dig in", etc. should be reported to Green Natural Gas Ventures LLC immediately.

COMMITMENT TO SAFETY, HEALTH, & ENVIRONMENT

Because of the many safety factors and the efforts of the operators, gathering pipeline leaks are rare, but they can occur, and if a leak goes undetected, it could prove to be a very real hazard. Most pipeline leaks can't be detected by sight. You might see areas of abnormally dry or hard soil, patches or dead vegetation, a white vapor cloud, or temporary discoloration on the ground. You also might hear a blowing or hissing sound, or you might detect an abnormal "gas-like" odor.

PIPELINE LEAKS — DO'S AND DON'TS

If you detect a pipeline leak, your first concern should be the safety of yourself and those around you. You should:

Shut off and abandon any equipment you are operating.

Leave the area immediately on foot (a vehicle could create a spark that would ignite a vapor cloud) and warn others against entering the area.

Immediately notify your local emergency response agency (911) or the local police and fire department(s).

Notify the pipeline company by calling the number on the pipeline marker.

DO NOT TRY TO EXTINGUISH A FIRE YOURSELF.
DO NOT TRY TO REPAIR THE LEAK YOURSELF.
